It follows up past successful events in Lucerne (CH) and Venice (IT). This year's theme is Intelligent ICT systems and their contributions for the implementation of Green Logistics Strategies.



The increased importance of ICT systems for the implementation of new holistic green logistics concepts has been recognized by stakeholders and researchers in the logistics sector. Therefore this year's conference focuses on the adoption of commercial viable integration of various solutions as developed particularly through EU funded research. The conference will look into different processes, services and functions of the different solutions, e.g. the provision of vital information in transport logistics, and it will explain how ICT can support information and process integration for economic and environment efficient transport solutions. It will demonstrate that it is possible to unchain the solutions and integrate them in a network in which different systems can share information.

Topics will include logistics concepts and interoperable platforms for close cooperation in supply networks and logistics operations, additionally addressing different aspects, e.g. Security, Visibility, Intelligent Cargo and Vehicles, from both business and technical points of view, including academic research.

This international event is organized by the University of Applied Sciences Vorarlberg (FHV) and several EU funded projects (Logistics for LIFE, e-FREIGHT, EURIDICE, INTEGRITY, SMART-CM and SMARTFREIGHT) The local host for this conference will be the Institute of Shipping Economics and Logistics (ISL) co-located in Bremen and Bremerhaven.

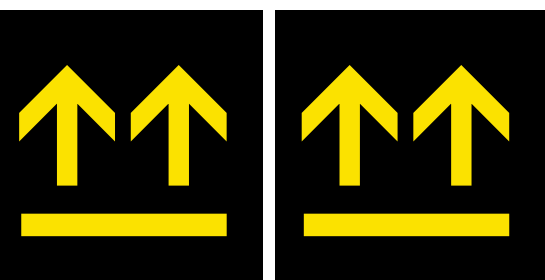
