- > 60% men and 40% women
- 39% engineering,
- 35% natural sciences, mathematics, or informatics and



How do you view your future career prospects?






Deviations from 100%: Rounding and/or reply option "I can't say"



What factors affect the choice of employer?




Mean of all answers on a scale of 0 to 100 points

Where do you see your position at the start of your career?





A Studies – Profession – Career

- The students view their career prospects in a positive light.
- Nevertheless, confidence regarding career prospects declined slightly in 2013 compared with 2011.
- We see a gap regarding confidence in personal competitiveness on the one hand confidence is growing, on the other hand there is also an increase in the lack of confidence.
- There is no big difference between male and female students as regards their expectations from future employers.
- The young talents want a career.







- In order to achieve career success, they focus on training programs.





In which countries would you like to work?



What makes a job abroad appealing?


